7.II. Consideration and Action on Police Department Computer Replacement Purchase of \$60,764

Background:

Many City computers have extended past the support life of Microsoft. Old and failing operating systems are limiting the effectiveness of staff, leading to delays, dropped information, down time and staff frustration. Replacements would have been requested in FY 2020. Reductions in finances and unclear revenue estimates due to the COVID 19 pandemic forced us to delay replacements. The City has sufficient funding in its budget for the replacement of the Police computers through our IT vendor, Liberty Technology, 18 desktops and monitors, and 10 laptops, inclusive of software, setup and installation.

7.III. Consideration and Action for the City of Hapeville to enter into an agreement with Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning for The Bright From The Start Summer Food Program 2021 and to Authorize Ashley Moody to act on behalf of the City of Hapeville as Principal and

point of contact of SFSP 2021.

Background:

The summer food service program (SFSP) grant has been utilized by the Hapeville Recreation Center for the past 9 years. The SFSP grant allows the City to serve food at no charge to children that attend summer camp, as well as children from around the Hapeville area. The Recreation Center serves breakfast and lunch Monday through Friday for all children under the age of 18, as well as adults with disabilities 19 and older. Breakfast is served from 8AM to 9AM and lunch from 12PM to 1PM and each meal consists of major food components like fruits and vegetables and milk.

This is a great program for kids and adults to utilize in Hapeville and the center is looking to have this approved so they may once again use the SFSP grant during the summer months. This will be a non-matching grant. In prior years this grant has been approximately \$16,000.

Recreation staff nominates Ashley Moody as the Delegated Principal for the summer of 2021.

5. OLD BUSINESS

5.I Consideration and Action on Board Appointment Ordinance

Motion for Board of Appeals - Alderman Rast made a motion to appoint Melanie Williams to replace Larry Martin, Councilman Alexander seconded. Discussion: Councilman Horsley recommends Larry Martin stays on the Board of Appeals and remove him from Planning Commission. Councilman Horsley made a substitute motion to replace Gabriel Cojocarescu position with Melanie Williams, Councilman Adams seconded. Councilman Adams asked for clarification. Alderman Rast referred back again to the recommendation of the City Manager. Motion carried 3-1 (Councilman Horsley opposed). City Attorney, Priya Patel confirmed that the first motion was negated.

Motion for Ethics Committee – Alderman Rast made a motion to table the Ethics Committee position until the April 6 Council meeting, Councilman Adams seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion for Hapeville Development Authority – Alderman Rast made a motion to appoint Cecilia Reme' to the Development Authority and to re-appoint the others, Councilman Alexander seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion for Development Authority of the City of Hapeville – Alderman Rast made a motion to appoint Kayla Fortner in place of Tania Wismer, Councilman Horsley seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion for Planning Commission – Alderman Rast made a motion to reappoint the three members with expired terms, Councilman Alexander seconded. Discussion: New applicants introduced themselves to Council. Councilman Alexander suggested reaching out to the applicants to see if they would be interested in serving on a board they did not apply for. Councilman Adams suggested adding a box on the application to be considered for another board if not selected. Councilman Horsley said he truly values the three people, but knowing that someone is moving, he probably will vote no

because it's a three worded package. Alderman Rast withdrew his motion in order to table until April 6, 2021, Councilman Alexander seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion for Design Review Committee – Councilman Horsley made a motion to replace Karl Dufrenne with Jacquie Smyth and to re-appoint the others, Alderman Rast seconded. Discussion: Councilman Horsley said it's time to allow other folks an opportunity. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion for Personnel Board – Councilman Adams made a motion to re-appoint the three members with expired terms, Councilman Alexander seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

City Attorney, Priya Patel said she can provide a summarized spreadsheet of the boards to Mayor and Council for review. Also, she reminded Mayor and Council that they'll have to appoint members to the newly formed Public Facilities Authority

Mayor Hallman told the new applicants to let the City Clerk or City Manager know if they would like to be considered for either the Board of Appeals or the Public Facilities Authority.

Motion: Councilman Alexander made a motion to re-appoint all members to the Board of Appeals except Larry Martin, Councilman Adams seconded. Discussion: Councilman Horsley said Mr. Slocumb had missed a lot of meetings. Councilman Horsley made a substitute motion to re-appoint everyone except Larry Martin and William Slocumb, Councilman Alexander seconded. Discussion: Economic Development Manager, Adrienne Senter said that Mr. Slocumb had not missed a meeting this year. Motion carried 1-3 (Councilman Adams, Alderman Rast, and Councilman Alexander opposed). Vote on the original motion carried 4-0.

MOTION: Councilman Alexander made a motion to waive first reading, Alderman Rast seconded. Vote 2-2. Mayor Hallman voted to waive first reading. Councilman Alexander made a motion to approve the ordinance as presented, Councilman Horsley seconded. Discussion: Councilman Adams said the draft ordinance is really involved. Mrs. Patel said that Council can always amend the ordinance. City Planner, Dr. Patterson said staff will have to inform Council when someone moves out of the city. Motion carried 3-1 (Councilman Horsley opposed).

6.II Consideration and Action on a Resolution in support of House Bill 708

Motion: Councilman Adams made a motion to approve the resolution, Councilman Horsley seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion: Councilman Adams amended the agenda to make the appointment for the Planning Commission, Councilman Alexander seconded. Motion carried 4-0. Alderman Rast made a motion to re-appoint all three members to the Planning Commission, Councilman Alexander seconded. Discussion: Councilman Horsley verified if there is a non-resident down the road that he/she cannot be re-appointed as it currently states. Motion carried 3-1 (Councilman Horsley opposed).

The City of Hapeville is tentatively slotted for \$2 million over the next 15 months. The guidance is still being defined on what it can be used for. The funds will come directly from the state. Lastly, he said that we are in the final negotiations with Fulton County on the library and the land around it. We can talk through it in the next executive session meeting.

Councilman Horsley said Mike Murray will be in our hearts forever. He asked about a speed calming ordinance being on the April or May agenda. Lastly, he said he will not be running for office again due to family decisions and a recent promotion at work. Mayor Hallman said his heart pours out to Laura Murray and her family. Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning

Delegation of Authority from an Officer to a Responsible Principal and/or Individual

New and existing institutions participating in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) or the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) must complete the *Delegation of Authority from an Officer to a Principal* at the time of submitting a new application or as part of annual application requirements.

Per federal regulations and Bright from the Start's Participation Agreement, institutions agree to accept final financial and administrative responsibility for management of an effective food service operation and to comply with federal regulations for the CACFP and SFSP.

Bright from the Start policies require all new and existing institutions to identify and designate an individual that will act on behalf of the institution and becomes Bright from the Start's point of contact, and binds the organization legally, financially and administratively as it pertains to the administration and/or operation of the CACFP or SFSP. A Principal is also subject to liability, separate and distinct, from the organization as it pertains to the administration and/or operation of the CACFP and SFSP. Officers authorized to delegate authority to Principals must be Officers of the entity, including board members, partners, or council/commission representatives of the entity and must have the authority to further delegate authority to a responsible Principal. The responsible Principal must be legally employed by the entity.

Therefore, institutions must submit the Form and documentation to support the Officer's authority to further delegate authority to a responsible Principal on an annual basis. Below is a list of acceptable documentation:

Public or Private Non-Profit Entities:

- Official, signed board meeting minutes, which at a minimum include the names of all members in attendance at the meeting, demonstration by vote that the entity accepts full responsibility to participate in the CACFP or SFSP, and acceptance of appointment by the Principal.

For-Profit Entities (entities required to have a governing boards and/or partnerships only):

- Corporations: Official, signed board meeting minutes, which at a minimum include the names of all members in attendance at the meeting, demonstration by vote that the entity accepts full responsibility to participate in the CACFP or SFSP, and acceptance of appointment by the responsible Principal. **OR,**
- Partnerships: Official, signed letter between partners acknowledging participation in the CACFP or SFSP, acceptance of full responsibility for participation in the CACFP or SFSP, and appointment of the responsible Principal by all Partners.

Government Entities:

The members of the board of ethics shall serve staggered three-year terms after the terms of the original members are completed. Starting on January 1, 2005, member one's term shall end. The term of member two shall end on January 1, 2006. The term of member three shall end on January 1, 2007. The term of member four shall end on January 1, 2008. The term of member five shall end on January 1, 2009. The three-year terms of future board members shall thereafter continue as staggered. The members of the board of ethics shall serve without compensation. However, travel and other expenses incurred on behalf of the city may be repaid. The mayor and council of the city shall provide meeting space for the board of ethics. Subject to budgetary procedures and requirements of the city, the city shall provide the board of ethics with such supplies and equipment as may be reasonably necessary for it to perform its duties and responsibilities.

Section Two. Codification and Certify. This Ordinance adopted hereby shall be codified and certified in a manner consistent with the laws of the State of Georgia and the City.

Section Three. Severability.

(a) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are or were, upon their enactment, believed by the Mayor and Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.

7 AN ORDINANCE FOR THE REAPPOINTMENT OF BOARD MEMBERS OF THE CITY
8 OF HAPEVILLE PURSUANT TO PART I (“CHARTER AND RELATED LAWS”),
9 SUBPART A (“CHARTER”), ARTICLE II (“THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL”),
10 CHAPTER 4 (“ORGANIZATION AND PROCEDURE”), SECTION 2-401 (“ANNUAL
11 ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING”) OF THE CITY CHARTER; TO PROVIDE FOR
12 SEVERABILITY; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; TO PROVIDE AN
13 EFFECTIVE DATE; AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES.

15 WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council shall have full power and authority to provide for the
16 execution of all powers, functions, rights, privileges, duties and immunities of the city, its officers,
17 agencies, or employees granted by the City of Hapeville’s Charter or by state law; and,

19 WHEREAS, the municipal government of the City of Hapeville (hereinafter “City”) and
20 all powers of the City shall be vested in the Mayor and Council. The Mayor and Council shall be
21 the legislative body of the City; and,

23 WHEREAS, every official act of the Mayor and Council which is to become law shall be
24 by ordinance;

26 WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council has the right to establish, abolish, merge, or
27 consolidate officers, positions of employment, departments and agencies of the City that are

30 WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council nominate and appoint the following persons for the
31 following officers for the 2021 Calendar Year in accordance with the City Charter.

33 BE IT, AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF

Section Two. Codification and Certify. This Ordinance adopted hereby shall be codified and certified in a manner consistent with the laws of the State of Georgia and the City.

Section Three. Severability.

(a) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are or were, upon their enactment, believed by the Mayor and Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.

(b) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is severable from every other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, no section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance.

(c) In the event that any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall, for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of the Mayor and Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality or unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not render invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of the Ordinance and that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, all remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional, enforceable, and of full force and effect.

Section Four. Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.

Section Five. Effective Date. The effective date of this Ordinance shall be the date of adoption unless otherwise stated herein.
